

CALCULATING ANNUAL REGISTRATION FEES for Docks & Moorings on Lake George

RESIDENTIAL DOCKS are those at a single family house used exclusively for boats registered to a person in residence at that house. Docks, leased, rented or made available to friends, relatives, acquaintances are defined as Class B or Class A Marinas and are considered Commercial Docks. If docks to be registered qualify as "residential", indicate how many docks are to be registered and compute your annual dock fee(s) by multiplying the number of docks by \$50. Compute the fee for residential moorings the same way.

ASSOCIATION DOCKS are commonly owned, multiple slip structures which provide deeded or contractual access from a residence or residential property within the Lake George Park. Each boat slip and mooring is subject to annual registration by the owner and annual fees of \$50 per slip and mooring. Association members are encouraged to pay for the association slips as a group to eliminate duplicate billing.

COMMERCIAL DOCKS are wharfs, docks and quick launch slips used as an accessory to a commercial use; leased or made available for use by any person for any form of remuneration or profit; made available for use by any person, regardless of remuneration or profit, other than the owner, owner's family or owner's overnight guest, or persons renting a single family residential unit which includes the use of a dock or mooring. The use of any portion of an association or residential dock or mooring as commercial dock or mooring renders the entire structure or complex commercial. If docks to be registered qualify as "commercial", indicate the total amount of linear dock footage by measuring the longest side of all piers which extend from the dock. Calculate the annual dock fee by multiplying this number by \$5.00. If needed, contact the LGPC for assistance in determining the useable length of commercial docks. Quick Launch Facilities are subject to commercial fees based on boat lengths.
